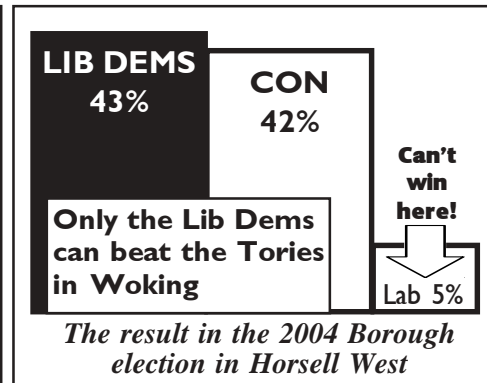

# Richard Sanderson & Gareth Davies - The best choice for our area



Local campaigner Gareth Davies and Cllr Richard Sanderson will continue to fight for the best possible services for Horsell.

**The Borough Council election on May 4th is expected to be a real battle between the Tories and the Lib Dems.** Labour cannot win around here.

In the Horsell West ward, the Lib Dems have selected hard working local campaigner Gareth Davies and Councillor Richard Sanderson as their candidates.

Gareth Davies says "I am honoured to be selected to fight for the seat vacated by former Conservative leader Jim Armitage. Having lived here for 25 years I am passionate about Horsell and promise to serve you to the best of my abilities. I am particularly concerned at the lack of progress in improving the Queen Elizabeth gardens area. Richard says "I am very interested in housing, leisure and planning. As a ward councillor, I and my Liberal Democrat colleagues have always tried to protect Horsell from unwelcome overdevelopment. I believe that the canal should form a natural boundary between the high-rise, high density buildings in Woking town centre and the lower density residential area north of the canal, which with its common land along Brewery Road and Chobham Road also forms an important green lung for the town. This view has not always been popular with other councillors, but I believe what local residents want. When I was first elected I helped to defeat a proposal to put part of what is now Victoria Way/Lockfield Drive over Horsell Moor. I attended and spoke at a Public Inquiry on the Borough Plan against the hotel proposal and also at the recent Common Land Inquiry. I have consistently campaigned against unsuitable developments on the site, including the recent County Hall project."

However, I have strongly backed the development of leisure and retailing in Woking Town Centre, which I believe has transformed the town into somewhere we can all be proud of. I am particularly proud to have been a part of this. I was on the Town Centre Subcommittee which oversaw the Peacocks/New Victoria Theatre project from 1987 to when work started in about 1990."

## Richard Sanderson: Re-elect your Lib Dem councillor for Horsell West



- Richard Sanderson has lived in Horsell for 30 years and has been a councillor (with one year's break) for Horsell West since 1983.
- He is currently Chairman of the Social Overview & Scrutiny Committee. He was Mayor for the 2003-04 municipal year and his mayoral appeal fund raised almost £25,000 for the Woking & District MS Society. Richard worked as an investment analyst for over thirty years most recently as a Research Manager with Lloyds TSB Private Banking. He retired in 2002 and since then has been a volunteer with a number of local charities.
